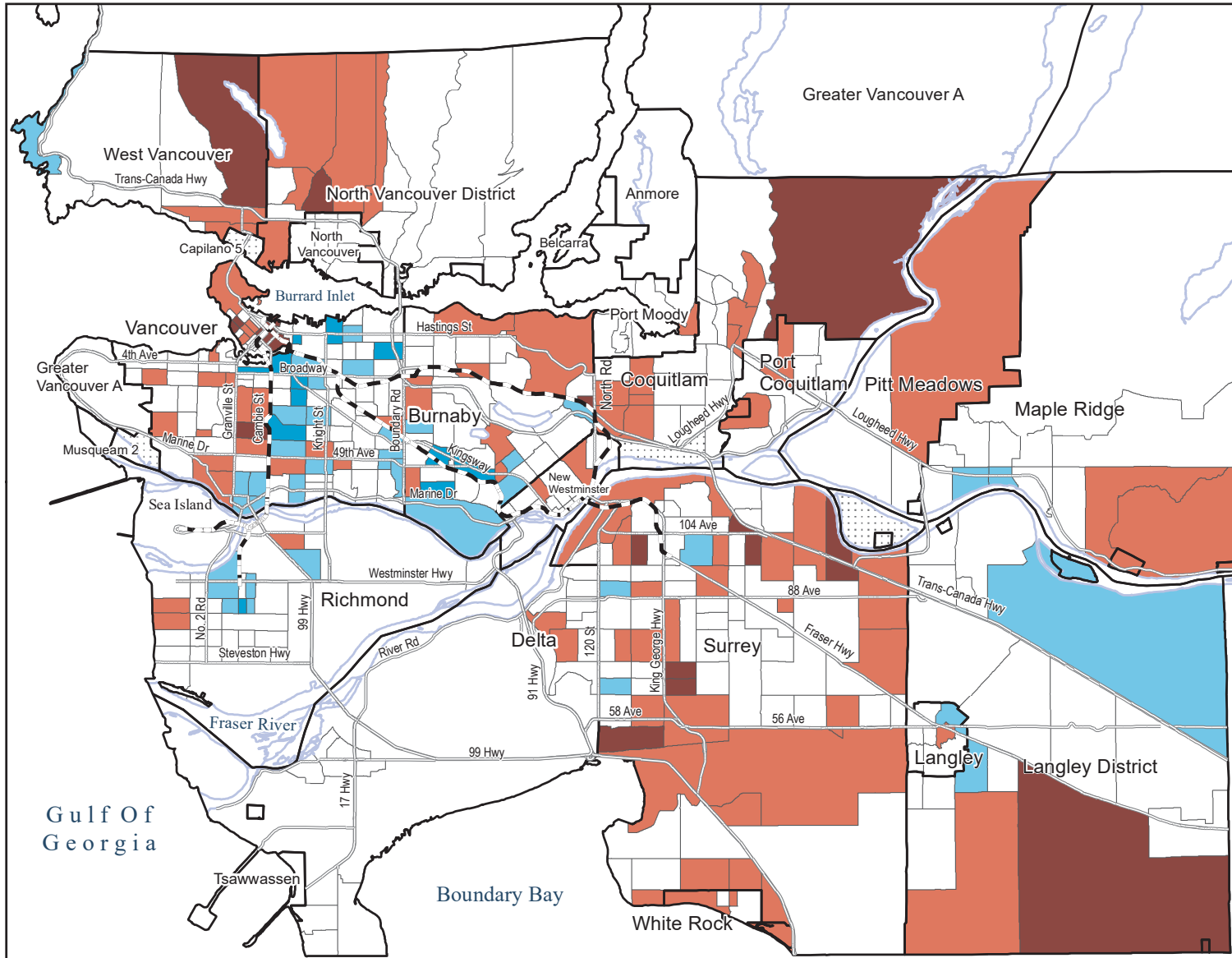


Change in the working poverty rate by neighbourhood, Metro Vancouver, 2006–2012, (in percentage points).



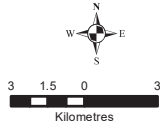
Change in the Percentage by Census Tracts (Percentage 2012 minus Percentage 2006)

- Decrease of more than 2.0 percentage points
- Decrease of 1.0 to 2.0 percentage points
- Change of -1.0 to 1.0 percentage points
- Increase of 1.0 to 2.0 percentage points
- Increase of more than 2.0 percentage points

Note: Data are mapped to 2006 boundaries. Working age population defined as individuals who are between 18 and 64, non-students and living on their own. Working status refers to persons having earnings no less than \$3,000. Poor status refers to individuals with census family income below the Low Income Measure (50% of adjusted after-tax median income of all Canadians) determined from taxfiler data (T1FF).
